You can no longer put your glass in the yellow-lidded recycling bins. Instead, collect your glass bottles and jars separately and take them to our new drop-off sites.

Glass jars and bottles must be empty and lightly rinsed.

**Place items loose in the bin.  
Do not put them in plastic bags.**
